





is the number of new single-family houses that were completed in 2021. That is a 6% increase from the number of houses built in 2020. However, that number more than doubles the 447,000 total from a decade ago. After hitting a peak of 1,654,000 houses in 2006, the numbers bottomed out at 447,000 in 2011 and have been gradually recovering ever since.

THREE-CAR OR MORE GARAGES



21% of all new single-family houses completed in 2021 featured a three-or-more-car garage, up slightly from 18% in 2020. The percentage of houses built in all four regions (Midwest, Northeast, South, and West) with a two-car or three-or-more-car garage jumped from 85% to 92% in 2021.

of new homes in the Midwest were built with a garage for three or more cars. The Midwest continues to lead all other regions with a greater percentage of new homes being built with three-car garages. Bigger garages mean more garage doors.
