For over 40 years, Wendling specialized in strategic planning and crisis communications, serving businesses, school districts, governmental units, nonprofit organizations, and trade associations.



Amarr welcomes two new sales managers



In April, Action Industries restructured its sales territories from four to six. The company added two new regional account managers to its North American sales team to cover the new territories.


